

Once there was a talking fan —












Personification means to give human qualities to non-living things or ideas such as-

Anger ruined him.

Here, in the same way, the fan is given human qualities of talking. It is also called 'He'.

Simile

Simile is a comparison between two unlike things using the words "like", "as" and "as.....as"

Examples

It is as blind as bat.

He is as wise as an owl.

He eats like a pig.

He/fan ran as still as water.
